We've installed a New Chimes system (\$9,400). They have been paid for! Great job and Thank You!

CLEANING (FLOOD) BUCKET KITS

We will once again be collecting items for the UMCOR flood buckets in May. These buckets will be used in places where people may have suffered losses due to natural or human-made disasters. These supplies help people begin the overwhelming cleanup job after a flood or storm. Our goal this year is to fill 10 buckets. All items must be in by June 3.

Note: All items must be new!

- 5 gallon bucket with resealable lid
- 5 scouring pads (NO stainless steel, Brillo or SOS pads – nothing with soap built in.
- 7 sponges (NO cellulose sponges due to mold issues)
- 1 scrub brush (plastic or wooden handle)
- 18 cleaning wipes (Handi wipes or resuable wipes)
- Liquid laundry detergent (2-25 oz. or 1-50 oz bottle)
- 1 Liquid household cleaner, 12-16 oz. bottle (no spray bottles)
- Dish soap (16-28 oz bottle any brand)
- 50 clothespins
- Clothesline (2-50 ft. or 1-100 ft.; cotton or plastic)
- 5 dust masks

- 2 pairs of latex gloves (durable for multiple uses – like you use for dishes)
- 1 pair of work gloves
- 24 bag roll of heavy duty trashbags (33-45 gallon)
- 1 Insect repellent spray 6-14 oz. (aerosol or pump, must have protective caps)
- 1 Air freshener (*If aerosol, cans must have protective caps*)
